

The following rules were omitted from the recently published rule book. The rules that were omitted are as follows:

Rule C8.01D Should a rally champion lose his/her eligibility to race in the All-American Rally championship by winning a local race, the appropriate Rally Regional Championship would then move to the next highest eligible point earner. Should a rally participant who has been declared a Regional winner and thereby eligible to race in Akron, decline the opportunity, said driver forever loses his/her eligibility to be included, going forward, as an eligible point earner in that division.

Rule C-8.02d Participants must compete in a division in their appropriate licensed All-American local race to be considered eligible for the Rally Regional title. Exception: Former local race champions are not permitted to compete again in a local race in the same division in which they were a former competitor in an AASBD World Championship race. However, if they are still rallying in the same division, they are eligible to earn points in the rally program and are eligible for the Regional title. Note: A past local champion still rallying in the same division in which he/she won the Local race is not required to participate in a Local race.

Rule C-8.02e The mailing address on file at the All-American Soap Box Derby office as of the current rally race year will be used to determine the Region for that race year. Participants racing for the first time in the current rally race year will represent that Region containing the residence at the time of the initial rally participation.

Rule C-8.02n To have your points considered, you must have a birth certificate on file at AASBD headquarters.

These rules are still in effect and will be incorporated into the 2009-2010 rule book.
